

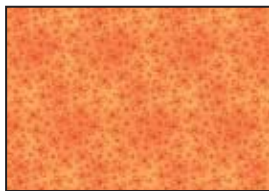

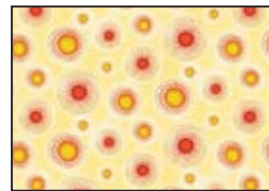

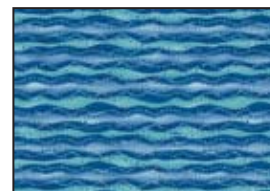

Skill Level: Advanced Beginner

Finished Quilt Size: 51½" x 65½"

Finished Block size: 7"

Fabric Requirements/Cutting:

Circle Fabric (6 Colors): 2/3 yard each

Cut 2 strips *each color*, 7½" x WOF

Sub-cut, *each strip*, 5 squares

Dimensional Border and Binding: 1 yard

Cut 6 strips, 1¼" x WOF

Outer Border: 1½ yard (*this is a directional fabric*)

Cut 2 strips, 5¼" x WOF

Following the Salvage Edge,

Cut 4 strips, 5¼" x Length of Fabric **

**print should follow the full length of the cut

Cornerstones: 1/3 yard (*enough fabric for 4 fussy cut squares*)

Fussy cut 4, 5¼" x 5¼" squares

Backing: 3½ yards

Pinning:

Pin 4, *of same color*, 7½" x 7½" squares together with flower head pins, wrong side of fabric facing up. Trace Template A and Template B onto the top square and cut out. Repeat this method with all of the squares, yielding 60 Piece A and 60 Piece B (*you will have extra*).

Put a Piece A and a Piece B together so that same color-ways are together but Piece A will be one fabric and Piece B will be the 2nd fabric. Place Piece B (pie shape) on top of Piece A ("L" shape) matching center points (figure 1), right side of fabrics together, pin in place. Match outside straight edges of Piece B to Piece A, pin in place (figure 2). It will be easier if you place this pin approximately ¼" away from the straight edge. Repeat for other side. You now have 3 pins holding Piece A and B together. These are all the pins you will need to sew this block. Piece A and B are not laying flat and this is okay.

Sewing:

It is recommended that you use needle down on your machine, if you do not have this function just remember to always stop with your needle down. You will be stopping and starting a number of times while sewing the curved edge together. With Piece B on the bottom and the pinned straight edge horizontal sew a few stitches to hold the pieces together, now remove the pin. Carefully manipulate Piece A so that the raw edges match Piece B. You will only be able to do this for approximately 1 inch, sew. It is okay to slightly stretch Piece B. Do not remove the remaining pins until you are ready to sew over them (sewing over pins is not recommended). Block 1 is completed. Continue with this sewing method until all the blocks are completed. The more you sew the easier and the faster the method becomes.

Iron towards Piece B, no steam, with an up down motion from the back side. Turn the block over and iron again. Let each block cool off before handling.

Following pattern *and color picture* lay your blocks out. There are 6 blocks to a Row and 8 Rows.

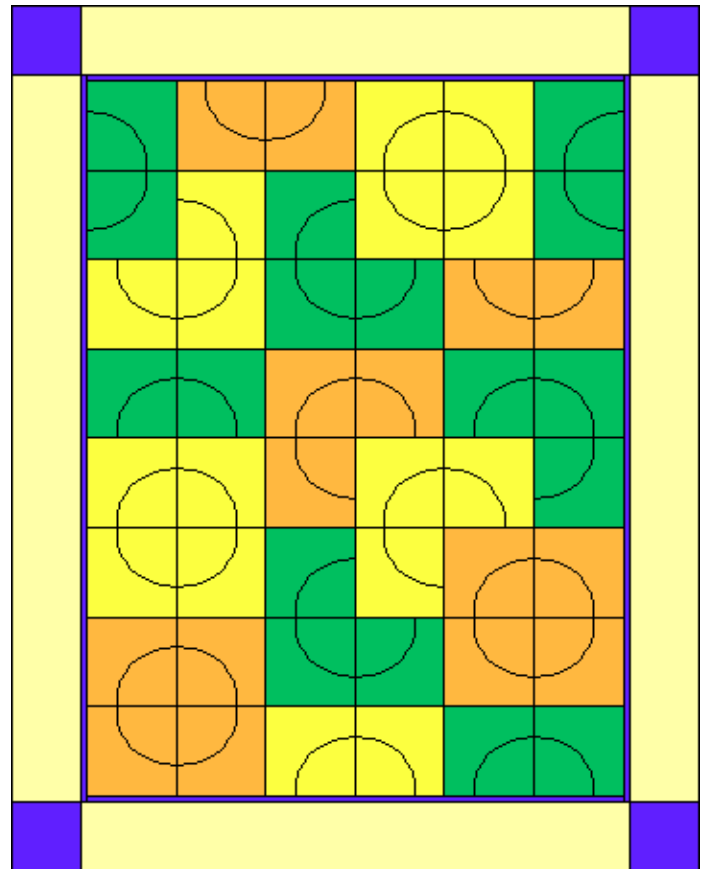
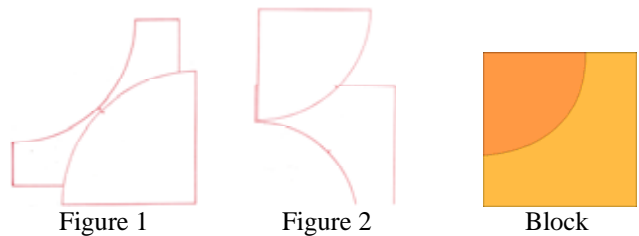
Dimensional Border:

Sew 2, 1¼" strips together, twice. Trim the 2 short strips, 1¼" x 42" and the 2 long strips, 1¼" x 56". Fold each strip in half lengthwise, wrong sides together and press. Sew the 2 short pieces to the top and bottom of the quilt and the long pieces to each side using a scant ¼" seam allowance.

Outer Borders:

Trim the 2 shorter pieces to 5-1/4" x 42" and sew to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Sew the remaining 4 pieces together to make 2 pieces and trim to 5-1/4" x 56". Sew a cornerstone to each end. Watch the direction of the cornerstones and the border strip, the images should all be facing upwards. Pin the border strips to the sides of the quilt and sew.

Layer and finish the quilt with your favorite method.
