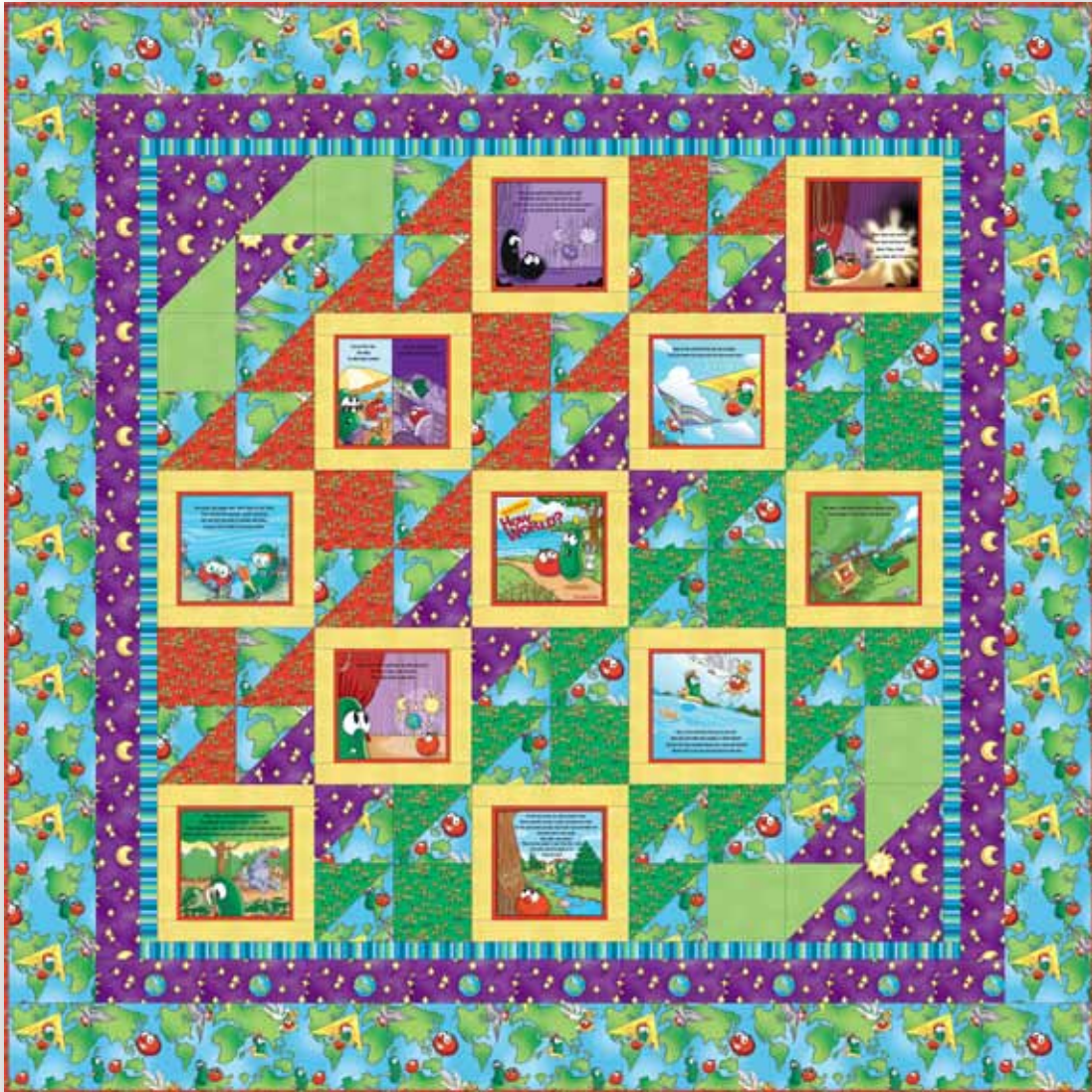


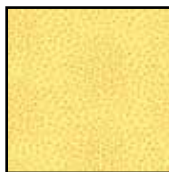

CUTTING

WOF= width of fabric
HST = Half Square Triangle
RST = right sides together

21994 SB - Book Panel:

- Fussy cut the 10 book pages plus the book cover. Cut $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the outer edge of the red border, into the yellow background.

22001 S - Yellow Dots:

- Cut (11) strips @ 2" x WOF; Sub cut into (22) 8" x 2" strips and (22) 10" x 2" strips.

21997 V - Purple Earth Toss:

- Cut (1) strip @ $9\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF; Sub cut into (1) $9\frac{7}{8}$ " x $9\frac{7}{8}$ " square, Cut the square in half once diagonally.
- Cut (1) strip @ $5\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF; Sub cut into (5) $5\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.
- Cut (6) strips @ 3" x WOF;
- Sew 3 strips together and sub cut into (2) $47\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" (sides middle border).
- Sew 3 strips together and sub cut into (2) $52\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" (top/bottom middle border).

21999 R - Red Daisies :

- Cut (1) strip @ $5\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF; Sub cut into (7) $5\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.
- Cut (1) strip @ 5" x WOF; Sub cut into (4) 5" squares.
- Cut (7) strips @ $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF (binding).

21999 G - Green Daisies:

- Cut (1) strip @ $5\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF; Sub cut into (7) $5\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.
- Cut (1) strip @ 5" x WOF; Sub cut into (4) 5" squares.

21996 BG - Blue Earth Scenic:

- Cut (3) strips @ $5\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF; Sub cut into (19) $5\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.
- Cut (7) strips @ $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF; Sew 3 strips together and sub cut into (2) $52\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " (side outer border). Sew the other three strips together and sub cut into (2) 62 " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " (top/bottom outer border).

22001 H - Light Green Dots:

- Cut (1) strip @ $5\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF; Sub cut into (2) $5\frac{3}{8}$ " squares, trim strip to 5" and subcut (4) 5" squares.
- Cut each $5\frac{3}{8}$ " squares in half, diagonally, corner-to-corner.

22000 Q - Stripe:

- Cut (5) strips @ $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF
- Sew 3 strips together and sub cut into (2) $45\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " (side inner border).
- Sew the other two strips and the remnant strip (above) together. Sub cut into (2) $47\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " (top/bottom inner border).

BOOK PAGES

1. Sew the 8" x 2" yellow rectangles to both sides of each fussy cut square. Press to the yellow. Trim the ends of the yellow rectangles even with the fussy cut book page square. Sew the 10" x 2" rectangles to the top/bottom of each fussy cut book page square. Press to the yellow. Square the block up to measure $9\frac{1}{2}$ " square. (Figure 1)

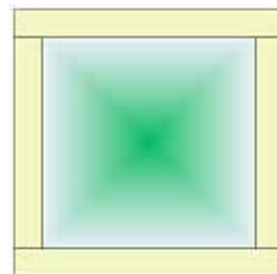
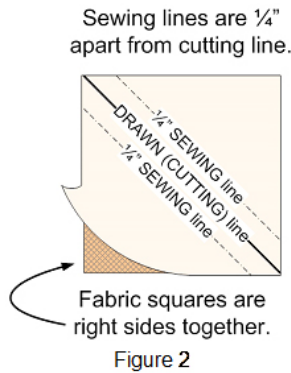

PIECED BLOCKS

2. Draw a diagonal line on the back of all (19) $5 \frac{3}{8}$ " blue squares (Figure 2).



3. Place a $5 \frac{3}{8}$ " blue square on top of a $5 \frac{3}{8}$ " red square, right sides together (RST).

4. Sew on both sides of the marked line, $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the line.

5. Cut on the marked line.

6. Open the HST and press to the blue.

7. This makes (2) 5" HSTs.

8. Repeat steps 3 – 7 with the remaining $5 \frac{3}{8}$ " red squares, and all the purple and the dark green $5 \frac{3}{8}$ " squares, always placing one of the marked blue squares on top of a colored square, RST. Set two of the blue/purple HSTs aside for the corner blocks.

9. Follow Figure (3) to make the pieced blocks. Lay out one light green square and 3 dark green/blue HSTs. Sew these together as shown in figure (3). Press the seams in opposite directions. The pieced block should measure $9 \frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make a second pieced block with this color combination.

10. Repeat step 9 to make the following sets of $9 \frac{1}{2}$ "

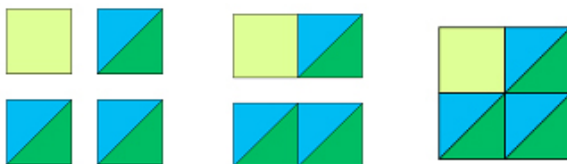

square pieced blocks: (Figure 4)

11. To make the corner blocks, lay out a blue/purple

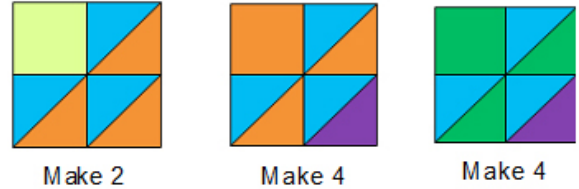

HST block and two light green triangles. Sew the HST block to the short side of the triangle. Press the seam towards the light green triangle. Repeat with the other triangle as shown below. (Figures 5). Make 2 sets.

12. Fold the large purple triangle in half, corner to

corner, RST, and finger press the center of the long edge.

13. Place the folded triangle on top of the pieced triangle, matching the fold line with the point and center of the pieced triangle. Sew together and press the seam towards the large triangle. (Figure 6). Repeat to make 2 blocks.

14. Follow Figure 7 and lay out the blocks. Sew the blocks into rows and press the seams in opposite directions for each row; row 1- right, row 2- left, row 3- right, row 4-left and row 5- right. Sew the rows to each other as shown in (Figure 8). The quilt center should measure 45½” square.

BORDERS

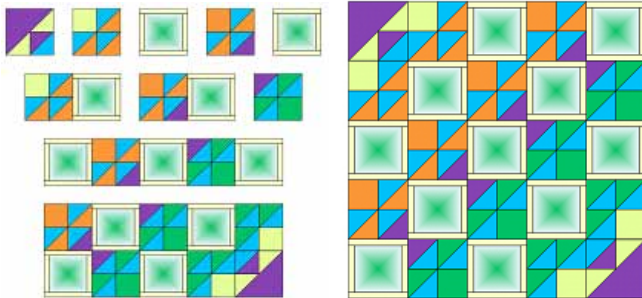

Refer to (Figure 9) for the following steps.

Note: When sewing each border in place, press

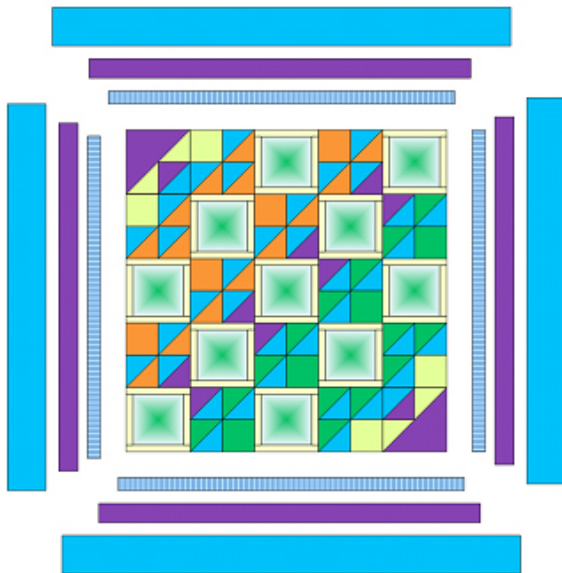

the border away from the quilt center. Also, verify that the quilt center is squared after each border is completed.

15. Sew the 45½” x 1½” striped borders to the sides of the quilt center.

16. Sew the 47½” x 1½” striped borders to the top/bottom of the quilt center.

17. Sew the 47½” x 3” purple borders to the sides of the quilt center.

18. Sew the 52½” x 3” purple borders to the top/bottom of the quilt center.

19. Sew the 52½” x 5¼” blue borders to the sides of the quilt center.

20. Sew the 62” x 5¼” blue borders to the top/bottom of the quilt center.

FINISH THE QUILT

21. Cut the backing fabric into two 2 yard pieces.

22. Using a 1” seam allowance, sew the two pieces together, along the selvedge. Trim the seam to ½” and press to one side.

23. Lay batting on top of the wrong side of the backing fabric

24. Lay the pieced quilt top on top of the batting.

25. Using your preferred method for securing the quilt sandwich, pin or baste the sandwich.

26. Quilt as desired.

27. Join the 2 ½” red strips together using diagonal seams. Use this strip to bind the quilt.
